Call for articles

To submit an article, you need to be aged between 12 and 20. You don't need to have any kind of experience to write the article, you just need to be passionate! We want articles that are original and interesting, that provide a fresh insight on the topic. Your article shouldn't be overly complicated or technical and should be accessible to everyone. As a rough guide most articles are around 2-6 pages in length although we welcome shorter articles around 500 words in length.

To send the article to us, you can either submit it as a word document and separate images to editor@ysjournal.com or by creating an account on our website www.ysjournal.com.

An editor will then review your article both for its scientific integrity and technically eg. SPAG and carry out any necessary edits, and may come back to you with revisions. Your article will then be published on the website, if it meets our standards, before potentially being published in the next print edition of the journal.

We will need:

- A short biography on yourself, 200-600 characters in length (with spaces)
- Your name, age and school
- A passport style photograph of yourself for the print edition. If it's not possible for you to send a photograph of yourself then we will use your school logo.

For us to be able to publish your article we will also need the article to be fully referenced in the Chicago style and must include an abstract or introduction.
